@ John Stith Pemberton: American physician and chemist from Georgia who invented the popular soft drink Coca-Cola. He was born in Knoxville, Crawford County, GA. After attending medical school – Reform Medical College in Macon - he was licensed in 1850. Dr. Pemberton opened up his own drug store in Columbus, Georgia. He later served as a confederate lieutenant in the Civil War. After moving to Atlanta, he began selling his medicines. His best-selling product was wine of coca which was sold as a cure for nervous disorders, disturbances of internal plumbing, and impotency. It was in 1885, in the backyard of his home on 107 Marietta St. in Atlanta, that Dr. Pemberton mixed up the syrup that would later become Coca-Cola. The name Coca-Cola came from Frank Robinson, a man he had met. He then sold the drink as a brain tonic for five cents, but it was poorly received. In 1888, sold the formula to [Asa Candler](#) for \$1,750. Dr. Pemberton died in Atlanta in 1888.



@ Dr Fred Joerger SINKING; NO HOPE FOR RECOVERY-At an early hour this morning news from the bedside of Dr. Joerger stated that the veteran was steadily sinking and that death was imminent.

Brunswick, Ga. May 6-Dr. Frederic Joerger, Brunswick's veteran druggist, died today in his seventy-fourth year. The deceased came from Baden Germany, and had resided here since 1876. The funeral will be conducted by the Masons, Pythians and Confederate Veterans Friday morning.

DR. JOERGER DIED TODAY-After an illness of several days, wife and children present. Dr. F. Joerger dies this morning at 4 o'clock after an illness of several days. On Memorial Day, as was his custom, Dr. Joerger turned out to do honor to the confederate dead. As a member of the Uniform Rank Knights of Pythias, he marched with that order, and that was his last appearance in [illegible], as he was taken ill that night. Owing to his age and his feeble health, which has been failing for some time, Dr. Joerger's death was not unexpected. A widow, who is his second wife, three children in his first marriage and four grandchildren survive. The daughters, Mrs. Richard Joiner and Mrs. George Otto, of Macon with the son, Frederick Joerger, also of Macon, were with their father at his death. Frederick Joerger was born in Germany seventy-four years ago. He came to America as a chemist and druggist, having been a graduate of one of the German schools of chemistry. As a young man, he settled in New Orleans and was identified with the drug business there. In 1876, during the first epidemic of yellow fever, he was sent to Brunswick by an association, similar to the Red Cross Society, and has resided continuously in the city since then. His first marriage occurred after he had become a resident of Brunswick, his wife being a Miss Freida Forrester. Dr. Joerger became prominent in the business and political affairs of Brunswick, and was several times a member of the council. As a secret order man, he became prominent also, particularly as a member of the Uniform Rank, Knights of Pythias, [illegible], a member of the Masonic Lodge. Dr. Joerger served through the war of '61 as a Confederate soldier, going from New Orleans [illegible] in several engagements. He was a member of Camp Jackson, U.C.F. and this camp will attend the funeral in a body.
